FIGHT ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE WITH INFECTION CONTROL

Antimicrobial resistance happens when germs like bacteria and fungi develop the ability to defeat the drugs designed to kill them. That means the germs are not killed and continue to grow and spread.

As a frontline healthcare worker, you play an important role in fighting antimicrobial resistance.

When you practice infection control, you stop resistant germs from:



Entering the body and causing infections through procedures and medical devices



Spreading to people from surfaces like bedrails or the hands of healthcare workers



Moving with patients when they are transferred between facilities



Spreading into the community, makina them harder to control

Infection control also protects you from getting sick and decreases the risk of spreading germs to patients.

THIS INFORMATION GIVES INSIGHT IN TO THE TRENDS OF COVID-19 IN COMMUNITIES SERVED BY A WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT. WASTEWATER SURVEILLANCE COMPLEMENTS TRADITIONAL COVID-19 SURVEILLANCE METHODS. UNLIKE OTHER TYPES OF COVID-19 SURVEILLANCE, WASTEWATER SURVEILLANCE DOES NOT DEPEND ON PEOPLE HAVING ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE OR AVAILABILITY OF COVID-19 TESTING.

WASTEWATER SURVEILLANCE DATA MAY SERVE A SANINDICATOR OF INCREASING OR DECREASING DISEASE TRENDS IN A COMMUNITY. THIS SURVEILLANCE RELIES ON COLLABORATION BETWEEN WASTEWATER UTILITIES AND PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENTS ACROSS TN.

Stay Safe During Winter Weather



Avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Only use generators and grills outdoors and away from windows. Never heat your home with a gas stovetop or oven.

- · Stay off roads if at all possible. If trapped in your car, then stay inside.
- Limit your time outside. If you need to go outside, then wear layers of warm clothing. Watch for signs
 of frostbite and hypothermia.
- Reduce the risk of a heart attack by avoiding overexertion when shoveling snow and walking in the snow.

Learn the signs of, and basic treatments for, frostbite and hypothermia.



Frostbite causes loss of feeling and color around the face, fingers and toes.

- Signs: Numbness, white or grayishyellow skin, firm or waxy skin.
- Actions: Go to a warm room. Soak in warm water. Use body heat to warm. Do not massage or use a heating pad.



Hypothermia is an unusually low body temperature. A temperature below 95 degrees is an emergency.

- Signs: Shivering, exhaustion, confusion, fumbling hands, memory loss, slurred speech or drowsiness.
- Actions: Go to a warm room. Warm the center of the body first—chest, neck, head and groin. Keep dry and wrapped up in warm blankets, including the head and neck.
